




The LaunchBoard, a statewide data system supported by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and hosted by Cal-PASS Plus, provides data on progress, success, employment, and earnings outcomes for California community college students. Dashboards in the LaunchBoard

Student Success Metrics—showcases student progression along various educational journeys, from recruitment to completion, transfer and the workforce AND student progression over 2-, 3-, 4-, 6-year timeframe for a first-time cohort of students

Community College Pipeline—is the most comprehensive dashboard with over 115 metrics, offering views of students at the industry sector and program level (TOP04 and TOP06)

Strong Workforce Program—is a subset of the Community College Pipeline dashboard for CTE students on all CTE programs, industry sectors and program level (TOP04 and TOP06) displaying a handful of metrics for the 17% SWP Incentive funding allocation

K12 Strong Workforce Program—displays information for 9th-12th graders at institutions in Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) awarded K12 SWP funding in Rounds 1, 2, 3 who successfully submitted CALPADS files to Cal-PASS Plus


Adult Education Pipeline—displays data for K-12 adult education and community college noncredit student journeys, including progress, transition, completion and workforce outcomes.



Two Views in SSM: Snapshot and Cohort


Snapshot -- looks at all data at a specific point in time

 Not necessarily the same students meeting the outcomes in any selected year



<u>Cohort</u> -- tracks student progression of the same students over different lengths of time

Same students who are first-time nonspecial admit in the selected year tracked over time to see if they are meeting the measured outcomes within the selected timeframe

SSM Snapshot View: only dashboard to display data for groups of students based on their educational pathways

All Students

Both metrics and students from ALL educational journeys

Adult Education or Noncredit ESL

- Build foundational literacy, quantitative, and English-language skills

SSM Cohort View: shows students' progress for students who enrolled as first-time credit non-special admit in the system

First-Time Non-Special Admit Cohort Students All students who enrolled as first-time in higher education nonspecial admit credit students in at least one primary term of the selected year with a minimal credit enrollment at the selected college who are tracked for 2-, 3-, 4-, 6-years from first term of enrollment












Equity and Student Success Metrics Views



- Same disaggregations are available in both snapshot and cohort views
- Allows users to see how student outcomes for different student populations compare and if there are persistent gaps. Use export to csv to see persistent gaps and easily compare to overall.








Cohort View has a Secondary Gender Disaggregation

In the cohort view, "View by Gender" is an option to further disaggregate the data

For students who **started in 2020-21**,

- ➤ Male American Indian students persist at a lower rate than female by 9%
- ➤ Male Black students persist at a lower rate than female by 5%





Note: All Other Values includes Non-Binary, Multiple Values Reported and Unknown/Non-Respondent 19 As more data becomes available for Non-Binary, then it will be displayed as a separate category




Cohort View has Incomplete Years of Data


In the cohort view, incomplete years of data, as indicated by the lighter bars, is available to see data before timeframe selected is complete

For students who **started in Fall 2020 or Spring 2021**,

- American Indian and Black students have completed much lower total units compared to other student populations at 16 and 17 while Hispanic and Pacific Islander students are also below overall at 22 and 20
- Have data through Spring 2022 but need 2023-24 and Fall 2024 data from 2024-25 academic year to allow students who started in Spring 2021 three years to complete units. So, THERE IS TIME TO ACT to address the gaps

What is new in the cohort view?


What is New?

- New Guided Pathways Metric Added to the Cohort View
 - ➤ Successfully completed 30 semester units (or 45 quarter units) in their first year from their first term of entry
- New Cohort Length
 - > Two-year timeframe added to the three-, four- and six-year timeframes

What has been updated?

Change to <u>Number of Students Identified as Enrolled in Postsecondary</u> compared to prior year

- Chancellor's Office provided additional information to UC, CSU, and NSC to more accurately identify students enrolled in other postsecondary resulting in higher number of students identified as enrolled in other postsecondary for this year's build compared to last year's build for all years (3% to 6% higher depending on the year compared to about 1% change in prior years) with the following impacts:
 - 1. <u>Transfer Metrics Impacted in both views</u>: more students found as transferring to a four-year institution
 - Transfer to Any Four-Year (SM 620, 650) counts are higher in the snapshot and cohort views by around 1% statewide
 - Transfer to CSU or UC, In-State Private and Out-of-State (SM 614, 615, 616) counts are higher in both views by 1% to 3% statewide, depending on the year






Change to <u>Number of Students Identified as Enrolled in Postsecondary</u> compared to prior year (continued)

- 2. <u>Other Metrics Impacted</u>: more students found as enrolled at a postsecondary and therefore less students found as first-time or exiting
 - Average No. of Units by Accumulated by First Time Associate Degree Earners (SM 613Sx, 617Sx, 618Sx) in the snapshot view are affected
 - Employment and Earnings Metrics:
 - Became Employed (SM 700Sx) in the snapshot are lower
 - Job in Field of Study (SM 701) counts in both are lower
 - Median Annual Earnings (SM 800Sx) in the snapshot is affected
 - Median Change in Earnings (SM 801Sx) in the snapshot is affected
 - Attained the Living Wage (SM 802Sx) counts in the snapshot are lower
 - First-Time Student Cohort (SM 122FC) counts are lower impacting ALL metrics in the cohort view since students 18+ are excluded if found enrolled in postsecondary





- Updates to Denominator for Successful Enrollment metrics:
 - ➤ <u>Both</u>: Records flagged as fraud_status=5, where the college has reviewed the application and determined that it is fraudulent, have been removed
 - ➤ <u>Cohort</u>: Bug also fixed to denominator to include applicants who were previously excluded



Successful Enrollment in Snapshot:

Denominators lower and percentages higher



Successful Enrollment in Cohort:

Denominators higher and percentages lower





- Updates to Average Number of Units
 Accumulated by First-Time Associate
 Degree Earners in both views
 - <u>Both</u>: code was improperly treating students who earned awards at multiple locales leading to inflated unit values
 - <u>Snapshot</u>: code for the denominator was not actually removing students who previously enrolled at a postsecondary institution when 18 or older per the metric definition



Both: Average units are higher for most colleges in most years with a few exceptions

Note: Denominators are lower due to issue noted previously with more student identified as enrolled in postsecondary even after fix to denominator in snapshot





- Updates to Denominator for Transfer to a Four-Year metrics:
 - ➤ Snapshot: denominator for all transfer metrics (any transfer, CSU/UC, ISP, OOS) has been updated to All Students (or student journey if selected)
 - Cohort: denominator for all transfer metrics (any transfer, CSU/UC, ISP, OOS) has been updated to All Cohort Students but same metric is included with denominator used in SEP (exiting cohort students who earned 12+ units within the cohort timeframe)



- Denominators higher and percentages are lower
 - ➤ Values are higher due to increased no. of students identified as enrolled in postsecondary for prior years noted previously
 - Note: original metric still in cohort view with denominator used in SEP

What is the summary of the changes for SEP?

1. What is the summary of changes for metrics included in SEP?

- a) <u>For the First Time Cohort Definition</u>: Because of the increase in the number of students identified as enrolled at a postsecondary institution when 18+, there are fewer students included as first-time for the cohort. **Slightly Lower Counts**
- b) <u>For the Access or Successful Enrollment metric</u>: Because of the fix to include first-time applicants who had previously been excluded and removal of fraudulent applicant records, this metric has changed. **Lower %s**
- c) <u>Transfer to a Four-Year</u>: Because of the increase in the number of students identified as enrolled at a four-year institution, values and percentages for transfer are higher, but denominators are lower due to fewer students found as exiting all postsecondary for the cohort. **Slightly Higher Counts**





What do I do if my 2022 SEP data has changed for the baseline cohort year?

- 2. Do I need to change my 2022 SEP Plan in terms of targeted populations?
 - No changes are required
 - Colleges should review progress through comparisons using this year's data
 - Colleges may, if desired, consider adding student populations that were not previously flagged as experiencing substantive DI*
 - The Successful Enrollment metric has changed more significantly. Some colleges used other
 measures for the access metric meaning that no change would be necessary. If a college
 used successful enrollment as the access metric for 2022 SEP, colleges may:
 - **Continue with planned activities** and focus the review of progress on the other metrics or by examining changes for any chosen groups using the corrected metric.
 - Consider adding student populations that were not previously flagged





What do I do if my 2022 SEP data has changed for the baseline cohort year?

3. How do I explain changes in the data to my colleagues?

- calculations to determine DI can be affected by any changes to the underlying data including updates submitted by colleges or updates mentioned previously
- 93% to 98% of primary DI flags for student populations did not change (depending on the metric)
- the substantial majority of them only changed in one year (so colleges attending to trends over time in choosing equity gaps to target wouldn't be affected)
- many of the larger equity gaps that most colleges choose to target are unlikely to have been affected


